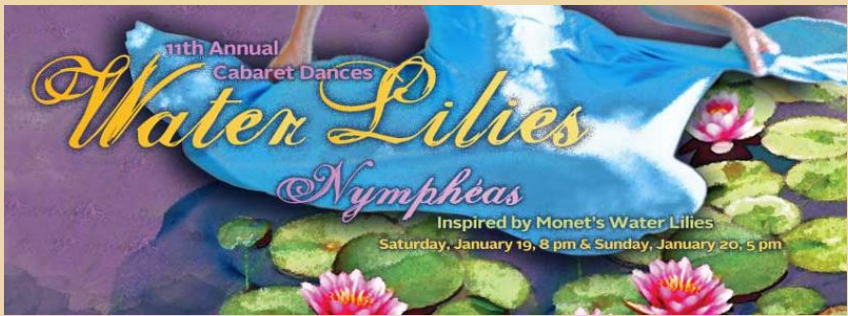

French Impressionist painter Claude Monet created some of his most famous works of art depicting his gardens of Giverny in the 1890's. Many artists have been inspired by the images and now choreographer Jean Isaacs among them. In creating work for the 11th annual Cabaret Dances, Isaacs is embracing the impressionist approach to capture an image that has only been "glimpsed" and is not detail oriented. According to Isaacs, "this artistic energy of creating quickly also permeates the rehearsal process. Rather than coming in with steps to teach, we are sketching and then filling in through a very collaborative process."



The evening combines all new dances with music composed by Faure, Debussy, Lauro and Villa Lobos played live by pianist Steve Baker and guitarist Fred Benedetti. Dancers include Blythe Barton, Annie Boyer, Matt Carney, Liv Isaacs-Nollet, Trystan Loucado, Minaqua McPherson and Kyle Sorensen. Trystan who has performed with San Diego Dance Theater for the past five years is currently on tour with Les Ballets Trockadero de Monte Carlo. This past season he has traveled all over Europe, New Zealand, and Australia. We are thrilled to have him here for Water Lilies. Don't miss this chance to see a rising star in action.
